	Heather MacLeod, Knowledge Translation Specialist, and Linda Hunter, family member, informed about an upcoming meeting.
	 Funding was secured for a meeting focusing meaningful and authentic engagement with residents and families in research projects across the long-term care sector and at Perley. The meeting is on Wednesday May 29 from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM at Lupton Hall.
	The meeting will host 30 participants, with at least half being residents and families. It seeks to set an innovative model framework within the long-term care sector in Canada, aiding in the creation of a roadmap to achieve desired goals. There is no fee, and includes an honorarium, and lunch.

4	Quality Improvement Plan Update
	Melissa Norman, Director of Quality and Interprofessional Care, presented an overview of the areas of focus aligned with the 2021-2022 survey outcome: meaningful activities and dining experience.
	Change ideas discussed include introducing intellectual programs like advanced trivia, lecture series, documentary nights, and book clubs, alongside calendar adjustments such as a master calendar in the cafeteria, a special events calendar, and on the website and TVs. The team is also considering timing changes for programs to reduce overlap.
	A family perspective led to the adaptation of the "All About Me" tool, focusing on enhancing social engagement and guiding staff on meaningful resident activity engagement. An updated poster for resident rooms will be implemented, with a trial set for G1S in May.
	The dining improvement team aims to enhance mealtime enjoyment by implementing small changes such as serving everyone at the table simultaneously. Guiding principles for all dining rooms will be established to ensure consistency.
